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1 ABOUT THE DOMINICAN REPUBLIC

This is a beautiful country located on large island south of Cuba & shared with Haiti. The people are a mixture of cultures and races.

Economically - The DR is one of poorest countries in the Western Hemisphere. There is a wide gap between rich and poor. Almost 70% of Dominicans are affected by poverty.

Government schools are severely underfunded and often don't even exist in the poorest neighborhoods. One-fourth of school children don't attend school. Health care is limited. Public institutions are poorly equipped and understaffed.



ABOUT LAST YEAR'S TRIP

Last October (2011) a group of 12 individuals went to the Dominican Republic. Early on, the trip became known as "The 2011 GIVE BACK TOUR".
